
Examination Mechanism

- If a student falls ill during the examination, first aid is given to him/her, arrangements are
 made to take him to the hospital, if necessary.
- An additional internal assessment test is conducted for those students who are unable to take the exam due to illness or any other reason.
- After the completion of the examination, these marks are placed on the student notice board and shared via WhatsApp group of the students for the information. that the answer book evaluation has been completed, the internal test marks have been prepared, within the stipulated time.
